TIP #1: CREATE SPACE

Low Budget

When you can't add more space, use space creatively

- Vertical space
- The backs of doors
- See our presentation on Using Space Creatively

Higher Budget

- Adding "functional space" is more valuable than aesthetic additions (bathrooms return 55% of cost; decks return 67%-77% of cost)
- Don't be the biggest house on the block.

TIP #2: PRUNE, LIMB & LANDSCAPE

Low Budget

- Tidy up! Trim overgrown trees; prune shrubs.
- Plant trees strategically to make use of shade to cool your A/C and house

Higher Budget

- Hire a professional landscape designer
- Many will sell you a plan, which you can implement over time



TIP #3: LIGHTS & LIGHT

Low Budget


- "Light" comes from fixtures and from windows—don't overlook updating window treatments
- Updating recessed lights is easy

Higher Budget

• Hire an electrician to add wiring where there is none or to upgrade existing electrical service

TIP #4: CARE & MAINTENANCE

Low Budget

- Don't overlook routine maintenance: roof, gutters, downspouts, driveways, sidewalks, steps; interior systems
- Learn how to do it yourself

Higher Budget

- Don't overlook routine maintenance: roof, gutters, downspouts, driveways, sidewalks, steps; interior systems
- Establish relationships with reputable professionals.

TIP #5: ADD ENERGY EFFICIENCY

- Tax Credits are Available for many energy saving improvements
- Energy efficient LED lights use much less electricity and will last indefinitely
- Good whether you are staying in your house (ongoing energy savings and increased comfort) OR getting ready to sell it

TAX CREDITS FOR ENERGY EFFICIENT HOME IMPROVEMENTS

10% of cost up to \$500 for many home improvements that will also save you money and increase your comfort:

- Biomass Stoves
- Air Source Heat Pumps
- Central Air Conditioning
- Gas, Propane or Oil Hot Water Boiler
- Gas, Propane or Oil Furnaces and Fans
- Insulation
- Roofs
- Water Heaters (non-solar)
- Windows, Doors & Skylights

30% of cost with no upper limit:

- Geothermal Heat Pumps
- Small Wind Turbines (residential)
- Solar Energy Systems
- Fuel Cells

TIP #6: THE FRONT DOOR

Low Budget

- Installing a steel front-entry door recoups more than 85% of the cost
- Make sure doorbell works

Higher Budget

- Refinish an historical door, or hire a professional.
- Lead-safe practices!

TIP #7: DON'T IGNORE THE FLOOR

94% of Realtors surveyed said spending \$600-\$900 to fix up your floors can be worth \$2000 when you sell.

- Pull up old carpet
- Cover or replace outdated floors (linoleum, pitted vinyl), especially if you are planning to sell
- Fix squeaks when you can get to them
- Replace broken tiles and patch damaged floor boards
- Hardwood floors and engineered hardwood floors hold their value the best

TIP #8: UPGRADE KITCHENS & BATHS

Low Budget

- Stick with original layout
- Reuse everything you can
- Replacing appliances can save you money
- New paint = New look
- Minor remodels can return over 90% of your investment

Higher Budget

- Change your kitchen layout to reflect your workflow
- Major remodels pay back 76% of cost

MIDRANGE MINOR KITCHEN REMODEL

In a functional but dated 200-square-foot kitchen with 30 linear feet of cabinetry and countertops,

- Leave cabinet boxes in place but replace fronts with new raisedpanel wood doors and drawers, including new hardware
- Replace wall oven and cooktop with new energy-efficient models
- Replace laminate countertops
- Install midpriced sink and faucet
- Repaint trim, add wall covering, and remove and replace resilient flooring
- 2016 Cost: \$20,122 Value: \$16,716 83.1% return

TIP #9: DECOR

Low Budget

- Paint, paint, paint
- Remove dated wallpaper
- Remove "popcorn" ceilings
- Use neutral colors if you plan to sell
- New pillows, bed clothes, curtains

Higher Budget

- Decorative moldings: crown and/or chair rail
- Quality ceiling fans
- Outdoor patio or deck (can recover 30-60% of an average patio)
- Remove paneling

TIP #10: REMOVE THE QUESTION MARKS

Fix the quirks!

- The side door that you have to open by giving it a shoulder.
- The front mail slot that you've taped over so the mailman won't use it
- The uneven sidewalk, the wobbly porch railing

If you're staying in your home, it'll work better.

If you're selling your home, you'll take away potential buyer's objections.
